Projects include the upcoming elevated sci-fi TV series, *Atom*, feature films *The Castle* and *Transcon*, and documentaries *Borrowed Village* and *The Rest I Make Up*. RUSSIA

A POLITICAL SURVEY FROM GORBACHEV TO PUTIN

Professor Anne O'Donnell, Moderator



This Seminar will explore Russia's recent history, from the sudden collapse of the Soviet Union under Mikhail Gorbachev to the enduring power of Vladimir Putin. Why did Gorbachev decide to "reform" the Soviet system, and why did reform lead to collapse? After decades locked in Cold War with the United States, why did collapse, in the end, come about so peacefully? How was Russia ruled in the 1990s under Boris Yeltsin? What was Russia in the process of becoming – a democracy? dictatorship? – and what was the experience of ordinary people through this tumultuous transition? Why has Russia ended up, in 2017, once again in the hands of a lone powerful ruler? **Video will be used.**

HEATHER WATTS joined New York City Ballet in 1970 and was one of the last of the famed Balanchine Ballerinas. Watts worked closely with George Balanchine and Jerome Robbins at NYCB, and was an acclaimed international ballet star retiring from the stage in 1995. Watts is a contributing editor at Vanity Fair magazine. She has created academic courses on Balanchine's life and work at Harvard University, was the Visiting Lecturer in Dance at Princeton University in 2012. She was an inaugural fellow at the Institute of Ballet, NYU in 2014. Watts received a Doctorate in Fine Arts *honoris causa* from Hunter College.

The distinctive style of multi-talented director, choreographer, dancer, actor, and screenwriter Bob Fosse helped define the American musical for decades. From early television appearances on shows like *Your Hit Parade* and the *Colgate Comedy Hour* to directing dozens of productions for stage and film including *Sweet Charity*, *Pippin*, *Chicago* and the Academy Award-winning, *Cabaret*, Fosse rose through the ranks of showbiz to become a leading director and innovator of Broadway and Hollywood musical hits. Through the lens of the now classic shows he brought to life, this Seminar will explore the realm of Fosse's talents, the stars he worked with, and his unique contribution to the canon of great American musicals. **Video will be used.**

LOWELL PETTIT - Art Historian, Contemporary Art Advisor (Pettit Art Partners), educator, and independent curator. He has lectured on the history and business of art for the Metropolitan Museum of Art, Museum of Modern Art, Guggenheim Museum, New York University, Christie's Education and Sotheby's Institute of Art, on whose faculty he has served since 2001. Pettit has been featured in many publications including *The New York Times*, *New York Observer*, *Fortune*, *Forbes*, *Bloomberg*, and *ArtNews*. He graduated from Collegiate School and earned his BA with honors in Studio Art and Art History from Wesleyan University in 1995.
